Owner: Mr. Cecil Edwards, 1756 Valley Avenue, Baker Oregon.

Area: One unpatented lode claim.

Location: High on the Burnt River slope of the mountain between Deer Creek and Dark Canyon in the section as given above. Access is by 10 miles of good dirt logging road up Ebell from U.S. highway 30. The Ebell Creek-U.S. 30 junction is situated a few miles east of Baker and since the U.P. mainline parallels the highway at this point, 10 miles is also the shortest distance to rail facilities.

General: The occurrence is comprised of dense, dead white quartz of obviously high purity. It is bounded by a schist country rock. Details of the occurrences surface dimensions as revealed by both natural outcrops and shallow trenches are shown on the attached sketch.
