Gentlemen;

The following is a description of 200 acres at Arago which may be classes as coal land: Lot 3-SE $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{2}$ -S $\frac{1}{2}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$ -W $\frac{1}{2}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$ -S $\frac{1}{2}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$. I copied these numbers from a tax receipt that was rather dim but I believe I have the 200 acres.

My father discovered a large vein of coal on this property years ago, and on another part of it nearest Hall's Creek coal was taken out from a cropping to be used in the blacksmith shop for the old A.J. Smith camp on Hall's Creek. That was 50 years ago. My father has been dead for many years and I have never tried to do anything about the coal, hoping to sell the timber and thinking that maybe logging operations might uncover some of the coal.

Mr. Morrison has my full permission to help himself to all the samples he can find on my property.
