GLASCOW TOWNSITE COMPANY (coal)

Owner: Glasgow Townsite Company.

Location: $\frac{1}{2}$ sec. 36, T. 24 S., R. 13 W., northeast of Glasgow.

Area: Deeded land of unknown area.

History: Gilbertson opened the property about '89. About $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles of road were built and eventually some 500 tons were taken out.

(J. B. Lent) worked some 5 years ago - a tram to the creek was built but no coal mined. Coal Vein is variously reported as 7' to 3' thick; also there is a 3' clay property. An old adit was driven on the coal but is now caved. Everything ~~grown~~ to brush and nothing could be seen.

Geology: At one point some rock could be seen but poorly. The streaks appear to dip west some 25° . Nothing to measure with the Brunton. No data on quality of coal, or quantity. The old tunnel is some 200 feet above the creek level.
