Dear Mr Ramp

We have close down our coal
Camp and moved out untill
some time after New Years.

No one can see the magnitude
of our coal field in less than
four days of good weather.

We have four Tunnels all 100 feet
or better in length each a long^{way} on
foot. When we open Camp again
we would be glad for you to spend
a week with us.

That last report furnish by the
State department through the USGS.

Pure give us a Black Eye. when
There is a \$60,000.00 Bridge with in 1000 Ft
of our Tunnel. and millions of Feet of

logs being transported by our door every week. It looks as though that Jerry Rannels may take the mine over and if so, no doubt Mr. Dole will give him some assistance.

The powers - Glendale Road, Leaving Powers going south or up south fork of Coquille River. 17 miles out, Road Forks. one goes to Agness the other to Glendale, Grants Pass.

The Grants Pass Road leaves near the Bridge on Rogue River, ^{mou~~th~~ of Graves Creek} and connects the Glendale Powers Road at Saw mill Gap, all intersection of Roads have Guide Boards -

On the South end of Eaden Ridge there is a Timber access Road and a cement Bridge leaves the Glendale Road Our camp is at this Bridge

A boat all you could do in one

day is to look at Eaden Ridge
and we can assure you that there
is no less than 4 Beds of Coal
not less than six feet in depth
all under lying Eaden Ridge -

at this time of the year it is most
apt to be storming or heavy fog.

it would be a wast of time unless
we had the camp going where you
could stay at the mine.

I would suggest you wait until a
later date.
