J. E. Morris, of Prineville, Oregon, is superintendent in charge of development, and E. V. Maltby, of Prineville, is president of the Homestake Mercury Mines, Inc. The tunnel by which the ore body is being crosscut is now in about 155 feet, having been driven by hand work. This tunnel is expected to reach the ore zone at 250 feet. Air equipment is to be installed to speed up the work at the mine.
