Inclosed find letter from Mr. Roycroft and my reply to him. Mr. Roycroft is associated with Mr. Martin of Grants Pass in the Tiny H mine in the Mule Creek District.

Mr. H. W. Lawrence, a registered engineer, made an examination of the property early this summer, and at the time of his examination he thought that the property looked very good. But when he received the returns on his assays he changed his opinion, and as far as I know he has not as yet written a report.

I re-sampled the mine when I visited the Mule Creek District this summer and the returns on my samples were no better than Mr. Lawrence's.

I do not believe that it is my place to answer all of Mr. Roycroft's questions as he is employing an engineer for that purpose.


Dear Mr. Roycroft:

Dear Mr. Morrison.

Thank you for your letter of August 19th, and I am going to take advantage of your offer to help us by writing for more information!

I am ready to leave for the north just as soon as we have things around to where reasonable success is assured in securing the permit. In planning the trip I believe that it will be well to go in to the mine and straighten Boone out, also to secure from your Attorney in Oregon necessary papers relating to the title to the property. I received a letter from Robert Martin wherein he stated that Lawrence had told him he felt "that we could get a permit for a limited amount of stock to be issued for immediate development and stripping of the high grade that is now in sight".

In view of the circumstances and taking into consideration Lawrence's report and your preliminary survey, and our plans as outlined in my letter to you, may I ask your personal opinion as to whether or not our program is feasible? I believe that in our development work it will be well to go ahead under Lawrence's supervision. Please do not misunderstand my questioning, I am asking for my personal information, and, so to speak, off the record.

I am also wondering if I should see Mr. Nixon alone, or would it be better if an engineer accompanied me. Would there be any chance that you would be in Portland at a time that I could see Mr. Nixon? Has your report been forwarded to Nixon, and, if not, would it be well for me to go over the matter with you before seeing Nixon?

I believe the answers to the above will help me greatly in making my plans and I certainly appreciate the interest you are taking in helping us with this matter. Thank you for your trouble, and I trust that I will see you personally when I am in Grants Pass.
