The Bonanza Mines, Inc., is reported to have acquired a cinnabar property on Patrick's Creek from Dave Webb. Development was started immediately. The company, H. C. Wilmot of Sutherlin, manager, is mining and treating about 200 tons of cinnabar daily at its property at Sutherlin.

Oregon

A crew of 53 men is employed at Sutherlin, Oregon, by the **Bonanza Mines, Inc.**, S. R. Smith of 58 Sutter Street, San Francisco, president. Cinnabar is being removed at the rate of 100 tons a day and is treated in the company's Herreshoff and Gould furnaces on the ground. The operating staff at Sutherlin includes C. G. Whelchel, general superintendent; Durwood L. Rose, mill superintendent; Sam K. Smyth, chief mine engineer and chief chemist; Guy N. Hickman, master mechanic; and Van W. Holcombe, chief clerk. Executive offices are at 58 Sutter Street, San Francisco, where H. C. Wilmot, consulting engineer and general manager has headquarters. Richard C. Wilmot, field engineer, also works out of the San Francisco office.

Oregon

The **Bonanza Mines, Inc.**, at Sutherlin, Oregon, used a single furnace to handle mine output in 1943 instead of the three furnaces previously operated. The company employs about 50 men at Sutherlin, with C. G. Whelchel as general superintendent. Deep development during the year past is reported to have opened a smaller ore zone of higher grade. S. R. Smith of San Francisco, president of the company and H. C. Wilmot, also of San Francisco, is general manager.
