In regard to the missing section from the Black Sand print. I can only suggest that you have not found the section because it may not be in order, it may have become mixed up with some of the preliminary prints, or because it may have been lost while being printed. It might be worth while to call up Swenders and ask them to check up. I will be in some time this week and check up on the other possibilities.

In regard to the ~~the~~ location of a section corner on the Eagle plat. A-10 on the west line is on the North South center line of the section and 310 feet North of the South quarter corner. You might be able to find this in Allan's notes on transit traverse in the white vertical angle books. These books are on the shelf with the other black sand data.
