Dear Ray:

Mrs. W. R. Allen of Canyonville, P.O. Box 111, has been in the office and shown me samples of mineralized material. The rock, some sort of a fine-grained volcanic, apparently carries considerable pyrite. Mrs. Allen understands that it runs a few dollars in gold and silver. The property is right at the village of Canyonville and some work of drifting and trenching has been done. Mrs. Allen is very anxious to get someone interested and has an idea that the silver content would be enough larger than the gold to make the property workable even at present.

Would you be kind enough to stop and see Mrs. Allen on your next trip north from Grants Pass, take some samples if the rock is opened enough so you can, and form some opinion whether or not the property would be attractive to mine operators. I suggest that you drop Mrs. Allen a note a day in advance of your coming so that you can be sure of seeing her.
