Location: SE $\frac{1}{4}$  SW $\frac{1}{4}$ , E $\frac{1}{2}$  SW $\frac{1}{4}$  SW $\frac{1}{4}$ , sec. 10 ) T. 32 S., R. 4 W.  
NE $\frac{1}{4}$  NW $\frac{1}{4}$ , E $\frac{1}{2}$  NW $\frac{1}{4}$  NW $\frac{1}{4}$ , SE $\frac{1}{4}$  NW $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. 15 )  
six miles by road east of Azalea and 2 miles up  
Whitehorse Creek.

Area: 180 acres of associated placer claims, located 1930.

Equipment: One mile of ditch out of Whitehorse Cr., delivering 100 ft. of head. 650 ft. of 16 inch pipe and a No. 1 giant. Good road to property.

Mining Conditions: Porphyry and slate bedrock, lots of large boulders. Three acres have been mined, and the gravel is 6 - 10 feet deep. Channel about 200 feet wide. Not much timber.
