Dear Mrs. Willis:

Enclosed is copy of assay report from our State Assay Laboratory at Grants Pass on the samples taken by Mr. Morrison, Mr. Swartley, and myself on your property near Glendale last Tuesday, September 27th.

I am amazed to note that none of the samples run more than 35 cents in gold. Under the circumstances I can see no point in suggesting that you take the matter up with substantial mining people for the reason that I am sure their answer would be the same as ours.

You might find, taking samples in a haphazard way of chunks or specimens, that you might get values of two or three dollars in some of this material, but, had there been any enrichment of streaks or small areas worth consideration, the effect of them would have increased the gold content in the samples which we took. Under the circumstances I do not believe it would be worthwhile to look farther into the outlying parts of your property with the expectation of finding higher grade material. The old-timers very likely put their tunnel in the area which panned best on surface.

If you can lease your property to some dredge concern, I suggest that you do so.
