Unfortunately the log of the Oakland Oil Well seems to have gone with the drillers, who took quite healthy money from the valley.

Digging into some old records, I am able to report the following, which may be of interest

I will be in and around Oakland and Sutherlin in the very near future and will see if there is any record of the log among the papers of the First State Bank of Sutherlin. The bank is now defunct and Mark Tisdale, who owned the bank has passed on, so that it is possible that any records may have been destroyed. However, I will keep it in mind and advise you immediately anything of interest is found.

When drilling was in full swing, it was generally understood that a depth of at least 4,500 would have to be made before returns were what was wanted. At Camp Two, east of Sutherlin it was considered that the structure was 1,000 feet less but I am not a Geologist and would not know if they were stringing me or not.
