The drainage in which Stroubs Mine is located was only recently assigned to this District so we had to do some research to answer your questions.

1. The type of mine is gold
2. One shaft is all I have seen. It is about 15 feet deep.
3. The native rock is rhyolite
4. The mine was active from 1929 to 1933. There doesn't seem to have been any activity there for years except souvenir hunters.
