

Chrome Ores—The Rustless Mining Corporation, the home office of which is at 3400 East Chase street, Baltimore, Maryland, has options on the Hanenkrats property near Prairie City, Grant County, belonging to I. B. Hazeltine, sheriff of that county. The company is interested in the chrome ores. The production from the property during the winter has been in the nature of trial shipments to ascertain the value of the ore for metallurgical purposes. A total of seven carloads were scheduled to be trucked from the property to the railroad at Seneca. The Rustless corporation also has chrome properties in California the product of which is to be shipped to Baltimore for use in the manufacture of stainless steel. H. F. Byram, formerly of Roseburg, but now located at Sacramento, California, is vice-president in charge of the western offices.

"At Hanenkrat's the rock is identical with that of the Ray mine. The country rock is a black serpentine. The ore body, which has been practically worked out, was wedge-shaped, 4 feet wide at the top, narrowing to 1 foot at a depth of 15 feet, below which it was not followed. The ore carried 30 to 40 percent of chromic oxide."
