Owners: Clair Tardiff, 409 West Alta Street, Pendleton; Albert Perard, Granite; James R. Thompson of Pendleton has Power of Attorney.

Location: NW $\frac{1}{4}$ sec.14, T.8 S., R.35 $\frac{1}{2}$ E. Road to property in good condition. About 1 mile northeast of Buffalo-Monitor.

History: Located before 1900 by Batiste Tardiff and relocated in 1914. Deeded to Clair Tardiff. Small production.

Area: 3 unpatented lode claims.

Equipment: 2 ore cars, 700 feet of track, old forge and bellows, large air compressor, and 2 cabins.

Geology: Country rock argillite. At least two parallel veins, striking N.60° E., and dipping 85° S., are cut by 360 feet of crosscut running south. The lower crosscut continues south past veins for at least 500 feet. No ore was seen in this portion of workings in a hurried survey. Another tunnel, 300 feet south and 250 feet above runs in 100 feet to hit a 40-foot shaft which has east and west drifts at the bottom. There is a total of about 2000 feet of workings. Vein no.1 is 2 feet in width, dips 80° S.; the second vein is similar but narrower where seen. Caved portions prevented complete survey.
