Location: Center of the north half of sec. 12, T. 8 S., R.
35 $\frac{1}{2}$ E.

Area: 8 unpatented lode claims.

History: Last worked in 1922-23. It is said that over
\$50,000 in high grade has been taken from this property.

Equipment: Four cabins and track. The old mill has been
disseminated. Compressors and cars, etc.

Geology: Country rock is mica schist and gneiss, cut by three
veins nearly vertical which strike north 45 to 65° east.

Development: Lower tunnel 430 feet; middle tunnel 880 feet;
upper tunnel 650 feet, with a 400 foot crosscut in both directions.
Veins in the upper tunnel are said to dip 35 to 60°, but this tunnel
was not visited since it was locked and the lessee was not at the mine
when it was visited. Two lower tunnels have been mapped but show
very little ore in the distances opened up.

Miscellaneous: Timber is abundant. Ditch line and pipe
supply water. Distance of 8 miles to Granite and 3 miles to the power
line of the Monumental Mine.
