HISTORY:

Small \$50.00 pocket of leaf gold was taken out last fall. Considerable pocket hunting in small shallow pits was done many years ago on the east-west vein.

· EQUIPMENT:

Small cabins, cars and track.

GEOLOGY:

The north-south vein which has been developed for about 500 ft. by a single drift, varies from 3 to 8 inches in width and shows relatively little mineralization. The vein is nearly verticula. It is said that it milled an average of \$15.00 a ton, that about \$350.00 has been taken out, and that it was very pockety. The ore shows large amounts of hematite in veinlets and cavity filled with limonite along fractures. There is some copper stain (chrysocolla?). There are many open cavities. The country rock is altered andesite, perhaps some argillite and with frequent breciated patches. Just south of the enterance of the main tunnel there is an old shaft which is said to have been 70 ft. in depth and across the gulch 30 ft. further south a drift now caved has apparently been driven on the southward extension of the vein. 600 ft. north from the tunnel entrance, or about 50 to 100 ft. beyond the drift end, out crops on east-west vein show on the surface for at least 200 ft. It is said that numerous gold pockets have been taken out of this verticle east-west which is composed of bluish quartz.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

It was suggested that if further work on this property were to be done, the extension of the drift for a distance of 50 to 75 ft. might pick up the intersection of the 2 veins with a possible ore chute of economic size.

Timber abundant. No water. Road $\frac{1}{2}$ mile from the Dixie Creek road.
