Owner: Dr. Hugh B. Fate, John Day, Oregon.

During the summer of 1940 J. W. Crewe and sons drove a 150 foot cross-cut for Dr. Fate.

"The Dixie Queen property is on the nose of Cougar Ridge between the East and West Forks of Dixie Creek. There are five claims in the group . . . The country rock is greenstone cut by diorite dikes. In several places the veins follow the contacts of these dikes.

"The Dixie Queen adit has been driven 200 feet and it is planned to continue this adit until a vein that crops out on the surface has been intersected. There are three small seams cut by the tunnel. These fissures contain a little quartz, gouge, and breccia, with sulphide. The veins strike N.15° W. to N.15° E. and dip about 80° E.

"On the surface and in the numerous other small tunnels and open cuts small veins are exposed. These veins have a remarkably persistent strike of N.10° E. and a dip of about 75°-80° E."
