According to a letter received from A.B. Woodward Jr., dated February 18, 1942, the Mogul Cinnabar Mine has ceased operation. quote

"Just a note to let you know there is no more Mogul Cinnabar mine. Ore pinched out all around except for two small shoots going down. Ore shoot was 17 # ore and then about 5 # ore. extent of each about 6"x2" in horizontal section. Mr. Elliott and I jointly concurred that there would be more lenses but that they would in all probability be too small to justify development required to find them so we pulled out all equipment and left another "hole in the ground".
