Hood River Grubstake, 1937

Name: New Deal. (gold quartz)

Owners: Carl and Wallace A. Moody, Parkdale, Oregon.

Location: On East Fork of Hood River 30 miles south of Hood River on the Mt. Hood Loop. Mr. Moody stated the claims were in Sec. 7, T. 2 S., R. 10 E., while the U.S.F.S. map shows the location to be in Sec. 10. The claims run east from the concrete bridge over East Fork Hood River one and one-half miles north of Sherwood Forest Camp.

Area: Four full size unpatented quartz claims. Location work performed on only one claim.

History: Discovered in spring of 1937. Nothing done since on the property.

Geology: A small amount of copper and gold occur in fractures of the rhyolite lava flows. The fracture opened up by the 15 ft. open-cut strikes S. 10° W. Elev. 2915 ft. Max. 5 ft. of snow.

Samples: 2 samples were taken from the open-cut. One run Au. .01 \$.35 and the other Au. Trace. No silver in either sample.
