CENTRAL POINT: April 10th: Southern Oregon's newest gold mining enterprise has been set up at Gold Hill by Oregon Ore Reductions, Inc. The plant is equipped for extracting fine flour gold from black sand by a chemical process. The plant equipment, according to company officials, will have a capacity of from 30 to 50 tons daily when in full operation. A new process for reclaiming the flour gold, heretofore lost in most mining operations, is utilized, John E. Winters, mining engineer, is field superintendent.
