This morning your telegram arrived regarding my inquiry about The Copper Girl Mine.

This mine is located (according to the report written by Walter Burke, mining engineer) two miles north east of the town of Rogue River, Jackson County.

The report states the mine has been closed for twenty years on account of a disagreement between partners and lack of finances to equip the mine properly. Also the mine is filled with water and the shaft and timbers have rotted and head frame destroyed.

The shaft is reported to be down 225 feet and a hine foot vein at that level. There are four claims of eighty acres connected with the Copper Girl in a group.

Has this mine been registered and work regularly been done to assure a mine in good standing?
