The mill at the Homa Mine located about two miles southeast of Rogue River is being converted for use in concentration of chromite ore by Roy A. Mills, Gold Hill and W. H. Holloway, Medford. The mill is under lease from the Tyrrell Manganese Co. of Medford.

The mill was constructed in 1947 for milling gold ore by G. S. Holmes, Los Angeles, California and R. J. Howard, San Mateo, California. The mill was operated briefly and all operations were discontinued late in 1947. The property has been idle since that time.

According to Mills, after present work is completed, the mill will include a hammermill, conveyor, a Gibson ball mill rated at about 50 tons per day and two concentrating tables. Initial operation will be on chromite ore from the Coyote Creek area in Northern Josephine county.
