Dear Mr. Zwan:

Sorry to have taken so long in getting the information on your "Lady Sue" claim. I am enclosing a copy of the report which was written after we examined the property.

I am not sure that the assay (RG-50, P-20843) came from the same deposit. You may recall that we discussed this possibility previously. The ore is, however, identical to the samples of high-grade from your claim.

Unless you are able to find several of these small veins which are closely spaced so that you are able to develop sufficient tonnage of the high-grade, arsenopyrite-bearing ore, it is doubtful whether you will be able to mine at a profit. It would probably be necessary to employ a cyanide process to recover the gold from this type of ore. If you are able to develop sufficient tonnage, feel free to call on us at any time for assistance or advice.
