High-grade gold ore is stated to have been discovered by Bert McTimmonds of Grants Pass, Oregon, and Chauncey Florey of Central Point at their mine on King Mountain in the corner of Jackson County where it adjoins Josephine and Douglas counties. It is planned to ship the ore from the mine to the San Francisco mint. The mine was leased last year to the King Mountain Mining Company of Yakima which drove a 390-foot tunnel at the property, but gave up the lease in May 1941.

The mine is located on Footh Creek six miles from Gold Hill. The new owners plan to install new equipment and conduct extensive operations. Test shafts are now being sunk, the mine comprising an area of 950 acres. Dredging will be started April 1, 1939.
