Development work is being carried on by the **Ruby Mines, Inc.**, in the Red Feather quicksilver property in the Upper Applegate district of Jackson County, Oregon. Old workings are being cleaned out and preparations made for the installation of a 10-ton Gould retort. G. D. Matson of Chehalis, Washington, is president and H. M. Meacham of Seattle is secretary-treasurer. R. W. Fletcher of Morton, Washington, is superintendent. The company leased the property from D. R. Luper, Star Route, Box 70, Jacksonville, Oregon.

The second year of operations is being started by the Williams brothers of Jacksonville, Oregon, on Bishop Creek in the Upper Applegate district southwest of Jacksonville in Jackson County. Original work was done on Pleasant Creek in the Gold Hill area. They later moved to Willow Creek and a year ago to Bishop Creek. Equipment includes a $\frac{3}{4}$ -yard Bay City gas shovel and 1-yard Marion steam shovel and a dry-land washing plant.
