John Day of Medford, Oregon, president of the Pacific Company, is reported to have suspended work at the Briggs Creek chrome property near Galice, Oregon, but plans to resume in a few months when road conditions improve. The company is primarily a construction concern, but in 1941 started prospecting chrome sands in the Bandon-Marshfield area. Recently it leased the Briggs Creek mine from Harry Sordy of Galice, owner, and made shipments to the Metals Reserve stockpile at Grants Pass.

Although production was delayed by late snows, the Pacific Company had shipped five carloads of chrome ore by July from its Briggs Creek or Sandy chrome mine near Merlin, Oregon. Production is coming from the Violet claim. In another portion of the mine the company is diamond drilling. R. B. McGinnis is general manager and David W. Proffit is mine superintendent, both at Merlin. The company plans to install a 100-ton milling plant.
