CAL-ORE MINE TO OPERATE AGAIN

GALICE, April 25.—(FW)—L. C. Hudson formerly superintendent of the Old Channel mine has accepted a position as superintendent of the Cal-Ore Mine located on the Galice Creek road two miles from Galice. Mr. Hudson will employ a crew and work will start immediately on the repairing of ditches and flumes which were damaged during the high water last year when the mine was in operation under the supervision of W. B. Grant. Hudson expects to erect cook and bunk houses in addition to a cabin for himself and family.

CAL.-ORE. MINING OPERATIONS BEGIN

GALICE, May 21. — (FW) — The Cal-Ore Mining Co., operating on Galice creek, two miles above Galice, completed the construction of flumes, ditches and undercurrents on Thursday and turned the water into the flume. On Friday, May 20, sluicing operations were started and continued until 5:30 p. m., when work was suspended to comply with mining regulations over the weekend. This company has distributed approximately \$2600 for labor, materials, supplies, etc., since April 26. The work has been under the supervision of L. C. Hudson, superintendent. He expected to resume operations Monday morning with three eight-hour shifts. A new dam was built 1600 feet up stream from the former dam which was washed out during the high water of last year.

Work is being started to bring the **Cal-Ore** placers on Galice Creek in Josephine County, two miles from Galice, Oregon, into production again.

Construction Starts At Cal-Ore Mine

GALICE (FW) — Construction work at the Cal-Ore place mine located two miles from the Galice Creek mine started Tuesday. L. C. Hudson, superintendent of operations at the mine, will again supervise the work. A crew of eight men is working at the present time building spill ways, repairing flumes, ditches, etc. They are preparing to work the lower bar and start piping as soon as the preliminary work of construction is completed. Mr. and Mrs. Hudson have moved to the cabin at the mine from their home at the Old Channel mine.

Cal-Ore Mine Operations Start

GALICE —(FW)— The Cal-Ore mine located two miles up Galice Creek road from Galice started mining operations Tuesday with four crews operating six hour shifts each. At present work on the upper channel is progressing. L. C. Hudson the superintendent stated that when more water for operating was available work on the lower channel would start and another giant be added. Since Nov. 1, a crew of five men has been reinforcing the dam up Galice creek near the Fowler property. They also built a new spillway to take care of the run-off during extreme high water. The entire crew is composed of local men.

Miners Cheered By Rain; Work In Full Blast

GALICE—(FW)—For the past four days rain has been falling almost continually in the Galice-Rand and Alameda districts and on Monday and Tuesday the first snow of the season was visible everywhere. There is plenty of water now for the miners who have been waiting for enough rain to operate their placer mines and every one seems to be in a happy state of mind because they are able to go to work. The Cal-Ore mine called back some of their former men on Monday to help with some of the preliminary work and they are expecting to summon the remainder of the men for the four shifts of six hours each by the middle of the week.
