

This report must be properly executed and filed with the Corporation Commissioner on or before July 1, 1930, in order to entitle a corporation mining for any of the precious metals, coal, or prospecting or operating for oil, or operating an oil well, to pay a license fee of only \$10. If not so filed, such corporation must pay the same license fees as are required to be paid by other corporations for gain.—Section 6890, Oregon Laws.

History: This is the old Dan Green Property. California-Oregon Company was formed March 7, 1937. It purchased the W. P. Barclay and H. P. Spradling water rights. About 30 acres have been mined. Informant thinks this was the old Galice Consolidated Mines Company's ground.

Geology: California-Oregon appears to be a remnant of the "Old Channel" or "High Level" placer deposits near Galice now operating in secs. 1, T. 35 S., R. S W. The gravel is only 9 feet thick and has an argillite bedrock. There is ten feet of overburden and lots of boulders up to size of a water bucket. Also has some clay. Mountain side operation; plenty of dump room. Mostly fine channel gold with small amount of coarse gold.
