History: This property has been worked, off and on, for a number of years. ~~About three or five years ago~~, a small mill was operated here, but no record can be found of any shipment.

Development: There is a 30 foot winze that is open. Another winze to the north has a small stope. There are several cuts.

Economics: The vein cannot be seen in place, but pieces on the dump indicate a 2 foot width. It is reported that the vein averages \$1.40 in gold, with some high grade up to \$14. Apparently, the vein has not been worked for its copper content.

Geology: Heavy sulfides are scattered, or bunched, in quartz. Principal sulfide is pyrite. Chalcopyrite is abundant. There is some copper stain near the surface.
