# Location and Topography

This claim is on a tributary of South Fork Galice Creek called Antler Creek. The creek is steep and narrow with steep hillsides. The claim as layed out  $(300 \times 3000)$  would include most of the drainage. The side creek is about 1/2 mile beyond the end of the lower road up this branch of Galice Creek.

# Economic Geology

The bedrock of Antler Creek is shale of the Galice formation. The stream gradient has not permitted the formation of significant bars. There is no evidence of mining or plans to mine.

### Pertinent Information

The claimant is permitting the occupants to live on the claim and build a cabin which will remain on the claim when Mr. and Mrs. Hood leave.

The Hoods have no idea of what is involved in mining. They are from North Carolina where his father is in a business remote from mining.

### Occupancy

The picture shows a framework and tent occupied at present. The Hoods still say their plan is to build a cabin on the site they have levelled.

## Conclusion

There is no mining and no discovery. The geology indicates that no discovery can be shown.

Validity should be determined before a cabin is built.

A validity hearing should be requested based upon the charges that:

- 1. A discovery has not been demonstrated, and
- 2. The occupants are not bona fide miners.
