Area:

Mr. Speaker stated that he owns 160 acres while the Assessor's map shows only 120 acres. He must be purchasing an additional 40 acres on contract which does not show on records as being under his name. The records show the S.W. 120 acres of patented ground.

History:

Henry Speaker and Father, Lem, have operated this placer intermittently for about 40 years. They have not kept any record of production and have no idea as to what it would be.

Water Right; He claims the first priority of 10 c.f.s. on Wolf Creek. The water is brought to the property through a 3 foot ditch 3/4 mile long giving a 135 feet head. Operating season is November 15th to June 1st. Elevation 1800 ft. Rough Greenstone bedrock. No clay. Lots of small boulders. At this point Wolf Creek valley is about 1/4 of a mile wide and is fairly level, making ideal placer ground. Gravel will average 2 to 3 yards in depth. He has never tested the ground but has a general idea as to where the channel runs due to his years of experience of winning with it. Ground is said to average about 10% per yard.
