The Anderson placers on the Illinois River near Selma, Oregon, in Josephine County have been acquired by J. M. Bulpitt of Santa Ana, California, and O. V. Barkman, now at Selma. A large stationary plant is being used and the gravel is brought to the plant by cable. While sufficient tests have been made to assure the new operators of the values, they plan to have further testing done with a view to bettering the washing plant. There is said to be an abundant supply of water for at least nine months' operation.
