"The Buckeye mine is owned by an Ohio company. It is about 5 miles northwest of Waters Creek station on Oregon & California Coast Railway, on the east fork of Slate Creek, in the N.E. part of T. 37 S., R. 7 W., at an elevation of about 2,650 feet, as measured by barometer. An adit extends N. 200 W. 65 paces without disclosing any ore or any distinct vein. At 50 paces crosscuts have been run both ways a few feet. A cyclone drill has been used. The ore on the dump contains pyrite, pyrrhotite, chalcopyrite, bornite, malachite and chrysocolla. The country rocks are serpentine, andesite, diorite, and shale grading toward argillite. The shale strikes east of north and dips about 450 S.E. Two adits higher up are said to be 60 and 70 feet long, respectively. The ore is in the andesite near the contact."
