Oregon

The Collard chrome property in the Waldo area of Josephine County, Oregon, is being opened by John E. Kennedy, Erne W. Watson, and Jerry C. Brisbine, who are leasing the ground from Guy and Jack Fetterley. Some equipment is being installed and the operators expect to be in production within a short time. During the fall of 1940 this property was investigated by the U. S. Geological Survey.

Ore from the White Rock chrome mine is being trucked to the government stockpile at Coquille, Oregon. The mine, located in the Rock Creek section of Coos County, Oregon, is being operated by James Rookard of Myrtle Point and James Kellond of Marshfield.

The Grande Ronde Pine Company, a lumber concern of eastern Oregon, has entered the mining business and is interested in chromite beach sands. Tests in a pilot plant are being conducted at Bandon, Oregon, and the company has leased property on the Seven Devils road north of Bandon.

Chrome deposits near Marshfield, Oregon, have been acquired by the Marshfield Krome Ore Company and that company is preparing to start operations immediately.
