FOUR LEAF CLOVER PLACER

Waldo area

Owners: Clark Dix, Cave Junction, Oregon, and Austin Jack, Grants Pass, Oregon.

Location: In the W_2^1 of sec. 19, T. 40 S., R. 6 W., on Sucker creek at the mouth of Cedar gulch, 5_2^1 miles above Greyback (about 3 miles of trail). Elevation 2000 feet.

Area: Two 20-acre unpatented placer claims, purchased from Bonny Roman and Ed Stulzman, located in 1932. Claims have been worked fairly steadily since that time.

<u>Development</u>: 150 feet of bedrock tunnel driven in a southerly direction in the old channel. Some work has been done along the creek in reworked old gravel.

<u>General</u>: Placer ground is up to 300 feet in width. Many very large boulders occur with best values found around them. Largest piece of gold found was about 17 pennyweight, 860 fine. In some places the values run as high as \$2.50 per foot of tunnel. Old workings with much old timbering are encountered.

Equipment: 400 feet of 8 inch pipe, hydraulic giant and fire hose. Cabin, home made donkey engine. Timber is abundant.
