

I read with interest your comments on Atlas Corporation's Grassy Mountain gold deposit, quoted in the Salem Statesman Journal on October 24th. After several years of being the only gold exploration company developing reserves in Oregon it is good to see others active in the state.

I was somewhat puzzled, however, as to how you classified Grassy Mountain as the "largest single discovery in Oregon history". At our Quartz Mountain property in Lake County we have one to two million ounces of gold (depending on cut off-grade used) in the proven and probable categories. This is based on 577 drillholes. At Grassy Mountain, Atlas has one million ounces in the "possible" category, based on 37 drillholes.

I have enclosed an information package on Quartz Mountain Gold. I believe that technical reports on the property are on file in the DOGAMI office. Please feel free to contact me, or our technical staff in Reno ((702) 829-1110) if you have any questions.

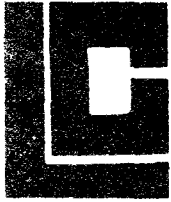
