Dear Guy:

The enclosed assay results are unfortunately typical of the type I usually take. Hope they don't discourage you too much. They indicate to me that the mineralized shear zones we sampled will not on the average pay off if worked. So the only way to work the mine is to stick to the enriched areas or ore shoots such as the one from which you picked the chunk of free gold. There are probably several of these richer spots in the area we looked over. The problem will be defining or outlining these rich spots by a thorough sampling program. Much of the rough determinative work should be done by mortaring and panning but the results should be kept track of on some kind of a master assay map of the workings. This way any pattern of enrichment will tend to show up. As you know one must be careful in cleaning the mortar and pan after running a good sample through. Assayers always run some pottery or pure quartz through their pulverizers to clean out any possible contamination.

I will add this assay information and my field notes to the report we already have. If the boss doesn't object I'll plan to spend a couple of days there next Spring or early Summer doing some mapping.
