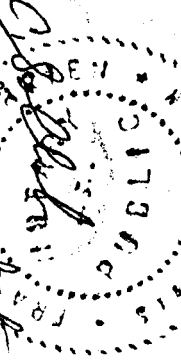
Statement:

Dear Mr. Aho:

The active properties in the Quartzville district, according to available information, are as follows:

1. The Lucille Claim, owned by C. F. McAllister who is developing in a large open cut on the Quartzville road.
2. Red Heifer claim, owned by E. W. Wheeler on the north slope of Red Heifer Butte near the Detroit trail. Mr. Wheeler is mining in a tunnel and raise and packing his ore to a slide which leads to a small hammer mill. The mill discharges on to an amalgamated plate.
3. Snowstorm and Bell claims, owned by Graves and Bush, who are developing ground formerly known as the Edson property on the slope north of the Quartzville road. They are planning to erect a mill.
4. Tillicum and Custillie claims, owned by Frank Bevier. These are southerly from the Albany group and include ground formerly known as the World's Fair and Golden Fleece claims. Mr. Bevier is mining ore from a tunnel, packing it to a slide from which it is fed to a small mill in Dry Gulch.
5. Bob and Betty claims on the northwest slope from the Detroit trail, owned by W. S. Risley. It is understood that Mr. Risley is planning to ship ore to be mined from a 12-inch vein of galena containing some zinc.
6. Riverside Group, reached from the Lawler Trail, owned by Geo. Oakley. Mr. Oakley is mining ore in a tunnel and sending it down a skidway to his Gibson prospectors mill at his camp.
7. Aho Brothers group, reached from the Government trail on Quartzville Creek. Development work is being done in a tunnel on an ore shoot reported to have had good gold values over a width of 6 feet at the widest part.

In the Quartzville district ore shoots occur in northwest-southeast trending zones. Some of these shear zones are wide and contain several ore shoots, but no development has ever been attempted to determine the economic possibilities of mining these large shear zones as a whole. Work at present, ^{and} always has been in the past, consists in developing and mining small individual ore shoots in the oxidized zone where values are for the most part in metallic gold. This oxidized zone is usually shallow and merges into sulphides with depth. Development has been almost entirely in the oxidized zone except in the case of properties near Galena Mountain, so that definite knowledge of the extent and value of the sulphide zone is lacking.
