Geology: Channels and lenses of well sorted fine sands and gravels in the Tertiary Lake Beds bordering Snake River.

Development & Equipment: Conventional dragline equipment including a $\frac{1}{2}$ yard dragline and a $\frac{3}{4}$ yard Bagley bucket line is used to dig gravel from a pit to a trommel. Estimated capacity is about 100 yards/8 hour day of about 50-50 sand and gravel, sand being $\frac{1}{4}$ " minus and oversize to $1\frac{1}{2}$ ". Equipment includes two $1\frac{1}{2}$ ton (4 yard) trucks and four men are normally employed.
