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VICTOR POINT ROAD CLAYS

Marion County

Location: Samples were taken by Treasher (38:60-61) at 7 localities along the Victor Point Road from 4.9 to 9.1 miles south of Silverton.

Description: The localities may be summarized as follows:

0.0	Silverton, intersection of Water and Main Streets	
0.4	Turn east (left) onto Victor Point Road.	
3.9	Continue ahead. Left hand (east) road leads to Drift Creek Falls and Loc. No. 18.	
4.9	<u>Loc. No. 19</u>	Iron stained clay in highway ditch.
6.0	<u>Loc. No. 20</u>	Iron stained, fine-grained, plastic clay in road cut, overlain by weathered arkose or tuff.
---	<u>Loc. No. 22</u>	Road cut on side road about 1 mile east of Victor Point Road. A badly weathered, iron-stained arkose or grit-conglomerate. Many of the small pebbles can be crushed to fine clay, and a few of the gritty particles appear to be quartz.
7.4	<u>Loc. No. 21</u>	Road cut immediately north of Victor Point School in only partially altered arkose or tuff.
7.9	<u>Loc. No. 23</u>	Plastic iron-stained clay in road cut.
8.5	<u>Loc. No. 24</u>	Gray plastic clay in road cut.
9.1	<u>Loc. No. 25</u>	White to red variagated clay, with varying degrees of alteration from arkose or tuff.

Analyses of the clays are given in the cited report.
