GENERAL:

Building blocks of the interlocking, mortarless type are being manufactured by this company using a pumice aggregate obtained from the Volcanic Materials Company of Bend, Oregon.

The plant is situated adjacent to and below a railroad siding. The raw aggregate is stockpiled along side the building and fed into an overhead mixer of  $\frac{1}{2}$  yard capacity which discharges mix into the Mortarless Tile press machines. The patented block produced by this machine is 6 x 8 x 16 with a wide variety of accompanying molding and accessory units. Blocks retail for  $24\frac{1}{2}$ %. Blocks are steam cured for 8 hours and allowed to stand in the shed for 24 hours. Two curing rooms provide a total of 900 sq. ft. of storage space. Intra-plant transfer of blocks is accomplished mechanically with a mobile Lift Heister.
