

Other properties on the creek, working or soon to be, are:

Carson Mining company, Anchorage Exploration company, formerly Ingram's Placers, and the F. Cushing Moore property

On the Carson property at the end of the Halfway-Carson road, a crew of three men struck bed rock Wednesday evening at an approximate depth of 38 feet.

Last fall the company lost its buildings and had a lot of equipment damaged by fire. It later started another shaft about 1000 feet nearer the creek.

The Anchorage Exploration company whose president is W. H. Lillard of Seattle, has been operating the mine this spring. He plans to put in a dredge, it is understood, if tests made by the Far West Mining and Milling company prove favorable.

The F. Cushing Moore mine, or James Chandler property, has been re-leased to a man from Seattle and is expected to open soon.

Almon Motley and associates are operating the Red Boy and Mountain Chief claims above the Queen of the West mill on main Pine creek. The claims proved to be very profitable last season and since

the snow went off the men have been working them.

This group of claims, it is reported, at one time belonged to Henry Mentle, a brother-in-law of the late G. R. Ladd.
