Am enclosing a section from an old forest map showing the properties I visited when I made a trip into Main Eagle Creek. These are all of the claims that I know of in that district.

- ✓ 1. Dotson claims (molybdenum) see report.
- ✓ 2. Abandoned claims (gold) formerly held by Charles Colton. (not visited)
- ✓ 3. Copper deposit formerly held by Gus Schirmer and William Landis. Of no commercial value.
- ✓ 4. Veatch claims (molybdenum) see report.
- ✓ 5. Kelly and Love claims. Heavy pyrite containing gold. Samples brought into office assayed from \$5 to \$10. Property not visited but believed to be valueless.

Great Northwest

Claims on Copper Creek, Wallowa County, owned by C. M. Dipeir, leased by Kenneth Grabner of Willow Creek this last summer. He ceased work due to winter, but believe he will work on these claims next year. (Not visited) Sample brought into office was bornite and quartz and ran Au Trace; Ag 76.8 oz.; Cu 38.6%.

Just returned from a trip to Susanville and Quartzburg districts.

Will have reports for Ore Bin in your office by the dead line, Monday morning.
