Key Steps in the Chemical Process Mining Application

- 1. Notice of Intent to submit a Consolidated Permit Application (CPA)
- 2. Notice of Applicant's Readiness to Collect Baseline Data
- Collection of Baseline Data
- 4. Filing of a *Consolidated Permit Application* including an operating plan, baseline data, reclamation and closure plan, and an alternatives analysis
- 5. Review *Consolidated Permit Application* for completeness and baseline data verification
- 6. Notice to Proceed if the application is complete
- 7. Preparation of an *Environmental Evaluation* and *Socio-Economic Impact Analysis*
- 8. State agency preparation of draft permits
- 9. Final permits
- 10. Consolidated contested case (if requested)

Project History

Jun 2012: Calico Resources (Calico) files a Notice of Intent (NOI) to develop a gold extraction and processing mine in Malheur County.

Jul 2016: Calico is acquired by Paramount Gold Nevada Corp.

Feb 2017: Calico files a new NOI that expands the proposed permit boundary to include the access road and power line route.

Nov 2019: Calico files a Consolidated Permit Application (CPA).

Feb 2020: PCC meets and holds a public hearing on application completeness. DOGAMI informs Calico that the CPA is not complete.

Project History

Dec 2021: Calico files a revised CPA.


Feb 2023: The Technical Review Team (TRT) accepts the final baseline data report as complete.

Oct 2023: The TRT accepts the CPA as complete.


Nov 2023: DOGAMI issues the Notice To Proceed.

Aug 2024: Stantec completes the Environmental Evaluation on behalf of DOGAMI.


Consolidated Permit Application (CPA) Timeline

Applicant: Calico Resources


Resource: Precious metals(Gold/Silver)

Disturbance: Approximately 487.9 acres of proposed surface disturbance

- 18.9 acres of private
- 469.0 acres public (BLM)




The Proposed Plan

- Mine life (as proposed):
 - 2 years of pre-construction
 - 8 years operation
 - 4 years of closure and reclamation
 - 26 years of post-closure monitoring
- Processing: Crushed ore will be chemically leached in the mill.
 Spent ore will be deposited in a storage facility on site.
- Employment: 100 120 people.
- Precious metal production:
 - 390,000 oz of Gold (~49,000 oz/yr).
 - 578,000 oz of Silver (~72,000 oz/yr).
