

Oregon Emergency Communications Tax

Prepaid Wireless Service/Product Information

Starting January 1, 2020, you'll see a tax increase on your receipt for prepaid wireless service or product purchases. The 2019 Oregon Legislature passed House Bill 2449, which included an increase to the existing Oregon Emergency Communications (E911) tax rate.

The Oregon E911 tax rate will increase from \$0.75 to \$1 for each prepaid wireless product or service transaction, occurring on or after January 1, 2020.

Examples:

- On January 1, 2020, Jane purchases one prepaid wireless card with 100 minutes and one prepaid wireless card with 50 minutes. Jane will see a tax on her receipt for \$2 (\$1 x 2 transactions).
- On January 1, 2020, Bob purchases a wireless phone bundled with 30 minutes of prepaid wireless service. Bob will see a tax on his receipt for \$1 (\$1 x 1 transaction).

Prepaid Wireless Service/Product Information

- On January 1, 2020, Bob purchases a wireless phone bundled with 30 minutes of prepaid wireless service. Bob will see a tax on his receipt for \$1 (\$1 x 1 transaction).
