## 3. Borton, Jeffrey (66135) Application Review: Parole & Probation

Presented by Cindy Park, Professional Standards Compliance Coordinator

Reason for Discretionary Review

The Department received an Application for Training (F5) and Criminal History Reporting form (F28) for Jeffrey Borton, in which he disclosed a previous criminal disposition. On June 25, 2021, in Yamhill County, Oregon, Borton was cited for the offenses of Driving Under the Influence (DUII) and Reckless Driving. On August 24, 2021, Bolton pled guilty to DUII and entered a DUII Diversion program.

Jeffrey Borton provided verbal mitigation for committee consideration.

A consensus was reached to adopt the record.

The Applicant Review Committee found the following moral fitness violations and factors:

#### Moral Fitness Violations:

- Dishonesty: The committee did not identify elements of dishonesty.
- Gross Misconduct: Borton violated the Board's pre-employment moral fitness standard for Gross Misconduct when he chose to drive a motor vehicle on a public roadway while under the influence of alcohol, running a stop sign at a highway intersection. His actions placed himself, others, and property at risk of harm.

## Aggravating Factors:

- The 2021 conviction is relatively recent.
- Multiple incidents of reckless driving in the case.
- Borton refused SFSTs
- 0.19% BAC
- Borton was non-cooperative with people throughout the investigation.

## Mitigating Factors:

- Borton completed the required diversion program.
- Isolated incident that was a life-changing event.
- Verbal mitigation was compelling.
- Lived experience can benefit others in paid and unpaid positions.
- Letter of support from the employing agency.
- Borton was not employed in a certifiable position at the time of the conduct.
- Borton was hired by the Lincoln County Community Justice, which is aware of the criminal background.

A consensus was reached to confirm the identified aggravating and mitigating factors.
