3. Bertsch, Jackson (62806) Application Review: Police

Presented by Melissa Lang-Bacho, Professional Standards Case Manager

Reason for Discretionary Review

DPSST received an Application for Training (F5) and a Criminal History Reporting Form (F28) for Jackson Bertsch, where he disclosed a 2013 arrest for Theft III. Bertsch ultimately pled guilty and was granted a diverted sentence, which he completed, and the charge was dismissed on May 16, 2014.

The Applicant Review Committee found the following moral fitness violations and factors:

Moral Fitness Violations:

- Dishonesty: Bertsch was deceptive when he attempted to steal merchandise from a local sporting goods store and was subsequently arrested for *Theft III*.
- Gross Misconduct: The committee did not identify elements of gross misconduct.

Aggravating Factors:

• The committee did not identify any aggravating factors.

Mitigating Factors:

- Bertsch has been hired by the Lane County Sheriff's Office who are supportive of his employment at their agency and are aware of the criminal disposition.
- The incident occurred nine years ago.
- The charge was the lowest level criminal charge for *Theft*.
- Bertsch's age at the time of the incident.
- The incident occurred prior to Bertsch's employment in public safety.
