2. Approve July 23, 2025 Meeting Minutes

A consensus was reached to approve the July 23, 2025 meeting minutes as written.

3. Rios, Juan (66172) Application Review: Corrections

Presented by Cindy Park, Professional Standards Compliance Coordinator

Reason for Discretionary Review

The DPSST received an Application for Training (F5) and a Criminal History Reporting Form (F28) for Juan Rios, where he disclosed previous criminal dispositions. On November 19, 2015, Rios pled guilty to *Driving Under the Influence of Intoxicants (DUII)* and entered a *DUII* Diversion Program. On December 17, 2015, Rios pled no contest to the offense of *Reckless Driving*, a Misdemeanor. Both charges were from an incident on October 21, 2015, in Salem, Oregon.

On May 30, 2018, Rios entered a "Friendship Agreement" deferral program in the Thurston County, Washington Superior Court for the offenses of *Assault in the Third Degree*, a Class C Felony, *Resisting Arrest*, a Misdemeanor, and *Malicious Mischief in the Third Degree*, a Gross Misdemeanor.

Juan Rios provided verbal mitigation for committee consideration.

Applicant Review Committee Discussion/Consensus/Vote	Second	Vote	Outcome

A consensus was reached to adopt the record.

The Applicant Review Committee found the following moral fitness violations and factors:

Moral Fitness Violations:

- Dishonesty: The committee did not identify elements of dishonesty.
- Gross Misconduct:
 - O Rios violated the Board's pre-employment moral fitness standard for Gross Misconduct when he chose to drive a motor vehicle on a public roadway while under the influence of alcohol and wrecked his car by hitting an electrical box and a fire hydrant, causing damage to property and putting himself and others at risk of harm.
 - Rios violated the Board's pre-employment moral fitness standard for Gross Misconduct when he engaged in reckless conduct that caused damage to the lobby of a hotel, and while resisting arrest, caused harm to a police officer by straining his wrist.

Aggravating Factors:

- The incident at Great Wolf Lodge with the level of intoxication and his behavior.
- Both incidents were alcohol related.
- Rios' behavior during both interactions with law enforcement is concerning.
- Rios' behavior led to him being tased and hog-tied to protect himself, others, and the patrol vehicle.
- Behavior at Great Wolf Lodge, urinating in public view of children and families.
- The amount of force required by the police to detain Rios.

Mitigating Factors:

- Rios has taken full responsibility for his actions.
- Letters of support provided that were written after the incidents.
- Rios has been employed by the Oregon Department of Corrections, which is aware of the previous criminal dispositions.

- Rios came in person today, and appeared sincere in his verbal mitigation regarding positive changes he has made and wanting to be a good influence on his daughter.
- The time that has passed since the incidents.
- Rios was not employed in a certifiable position at the time of the conduct.

A consensus was reached to confirm the identified aggravating and mitigating factors.
