Fire Certification Fingerprint Requirement Information

Oregon Revised Statutes (ORS) and Oregon Administrative Rule (OAR) prohibit fire service professionals who have been convicted of disqualifying crimes from holding National Fire Protection Association (NFPA), National Wildland Coordinating Group (NWCG), or Oregon-specific fire service certifications in the state. To ensure that applicants for fire service certification have not been convicted of disqualifying crimes, DPSST must conduct a state and national criminal background check. A part of this background check requires any applicant for fire service certification who has never been fingerprinted for the purposes of certification, be fingerprinted. Completion of the fingerprint requirement must be done at the time of submitting an E-1 Form or an Application for Certification and is a ON-TIME requirement.
